An Update from our Chief Executive

In November, I headed up to Leeds with Catherine Coleman, our Volunteering Manager to attend the annual Locality Convention. Locality are the umbrella organisation for community organisations like us. They research, advocate and campaign, consult about the work we do, offer advice and support and run networks and development sessions.

The Locality Convention brings imagine, we were all thrilled community organisations across the South Gloucestershire won. country together in one place.

This year's focus was on building strong local partnerships that unlock the power of communities, in particular how councils and funders have come together with local communities to create positive social change. There were workshops on workplace based health and well being and community led housing, and we heard from inspiring community groups that are really changing lives.

The convention traditionally ends with an awards ceremony. Last year Southern Brooks won a Locality Award for Bringing People Together.

This year we nominated South Gloucestershire Council for the "Keep it Local" award, as they are an excellent council to work with in terms of supporting the local Voluntary Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) sector and working in partnership.

There were a lot of entries and a shortlist of 5 other councils including Bristol. So as you can imagine, we were all thrilled that South Gloucestershire won.

We are now working with CVS South Gloucestershire, other voluntary sector partners and Locality as the Council commits to six 'Keep it Local" principles:

- Think about the whole system, not individual service silos.
- Co-ordinate services at the neighbourhood level.
- Increase local spend to invest in the local economy.
- Focus on early intervention now to save costs tomorrow.
- Commit to your community and proactively support local organisations.
- Commission services simply and collaboratively so they are 'local by default.

Locality has a pledge that they ask interested councils to commit to. We look forward to seeing how this work develops over the next 12 months.

SBCP awarded new Social Prescribing Contract

We are pleased to announce that our excellent community our new Social Prescribing Service starts in January. Funding has come from NHS England to all Primary Care Networks to provide this service and we have a 3 year contract to deliver the work in South Gloucestershire.

We are pleased to be working in partnership with Developing Health and Independence to deliver the service, building on

development work and their experience in social prescribing elsewhere. We will link closely with One You South Glos to ensure a seamless offer for people living in our communities.

Our senior Social Prescribing link worker, Lewis Wade starts in December and will be joined by newly appointed link workers in January. The project's aim is to give people time, focusing on

'what matters to me' and taking a holistic approach to people's health and wellbeing. The link workers will connect people to community groups and statutory services for practical and emotional support.

Diwali brings the community together

A lively and colourful celebration of Diwali, the Hindu Festival of Light took place on 19th October at Charlton Wood Academy.

Throughout the week, 90 children from schools across Patchway had taken part in workshops where they made delicate tissue paper lanterns filled with colourful lights, and the Youth Club had made two huge lanterns; a soaring dove of peace and an oil lamp. Children also learnt Bollywood dancing in some energetic and noisy workshops!

Bollywood dancing, drumming, and lots of Indian music filled the hall at the start of the event. Then everyone enjoyed a traditional Indian meal of vegetable samosas, rice, Tarka Dhal, spiced potato and cauliflower followed by Indian sweets.

Henna was busily being painted in elaborate designs on to hands and wrists while children played with

Rangoli sand art, making colourful pictures and traditional designs.

As dusk fell the lanterns were lit and the 200 strong crowd paraded together around Charlton Square led by a traditional drummer. People in the surrounding flats peered out of the windows looking at the colourful display below them.

This is the second year of Diwali in Patchway, run in partnership between Avon Indian Community Association, Patchway Festival Committee and Southern Brooks Community Partnerships.

I now manage a great team made up of a solid base of long term staff and volunteers that have been loyal to southern Brooks and the values for which they stand.

I am excited to be part of a new beginning for the cafe which now includes a new chef, Jamie, who has ideas similar to my own. We are confident that we can boost the posititity of the café further to the surrounding community.

Our plan is to provide great homecooked, inviting, healthy and locally sourced food within an established warm, friendly and welcoming environment. Our café is a place to be listened to and heard, respected and valued.

Myself and Jamie are working closely together to ensure we better utilise the Fareshare food we receive, encourage recycling and promote healthier food choices.

I am looking forward to the challenges of this role and hoping to put peoples thoughts and ideas into action. In the future I will be updating the kids corner. This will include a reading area, where a volunteer will be reading to the children, sensory play and a mud kitchen which will promote our outside/inside thinking. Plans are also in place to hold kids cooking classes, movie nights and reinstate the popular theme nights.

Within the first month I catered for two buffets and had the awesome task of catering for and attending the Southern Brooks Annual Celebration. The enormity of what Southern Brooks does within our community was evident at the gathering. I feel proud to now be part of that too.
